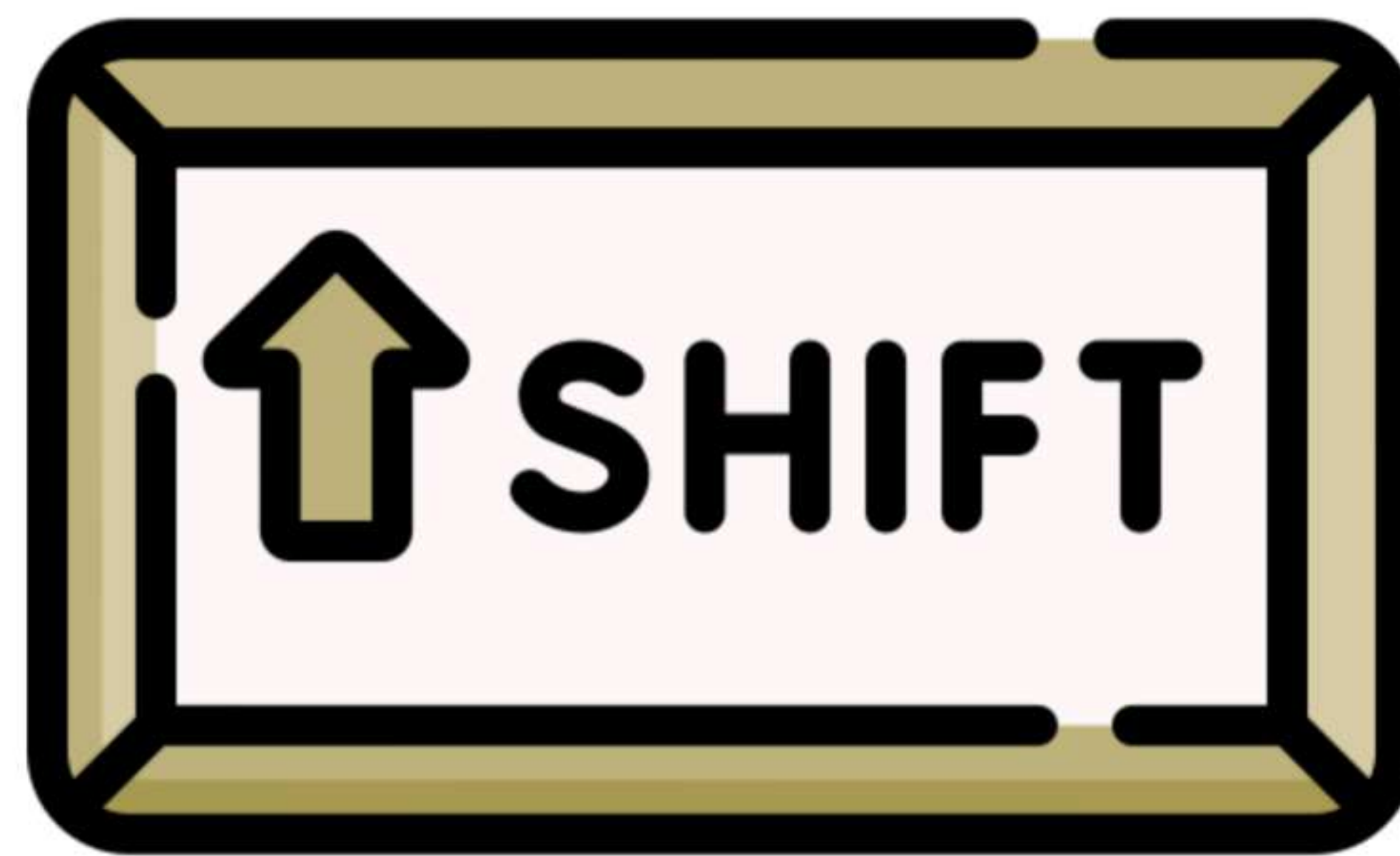

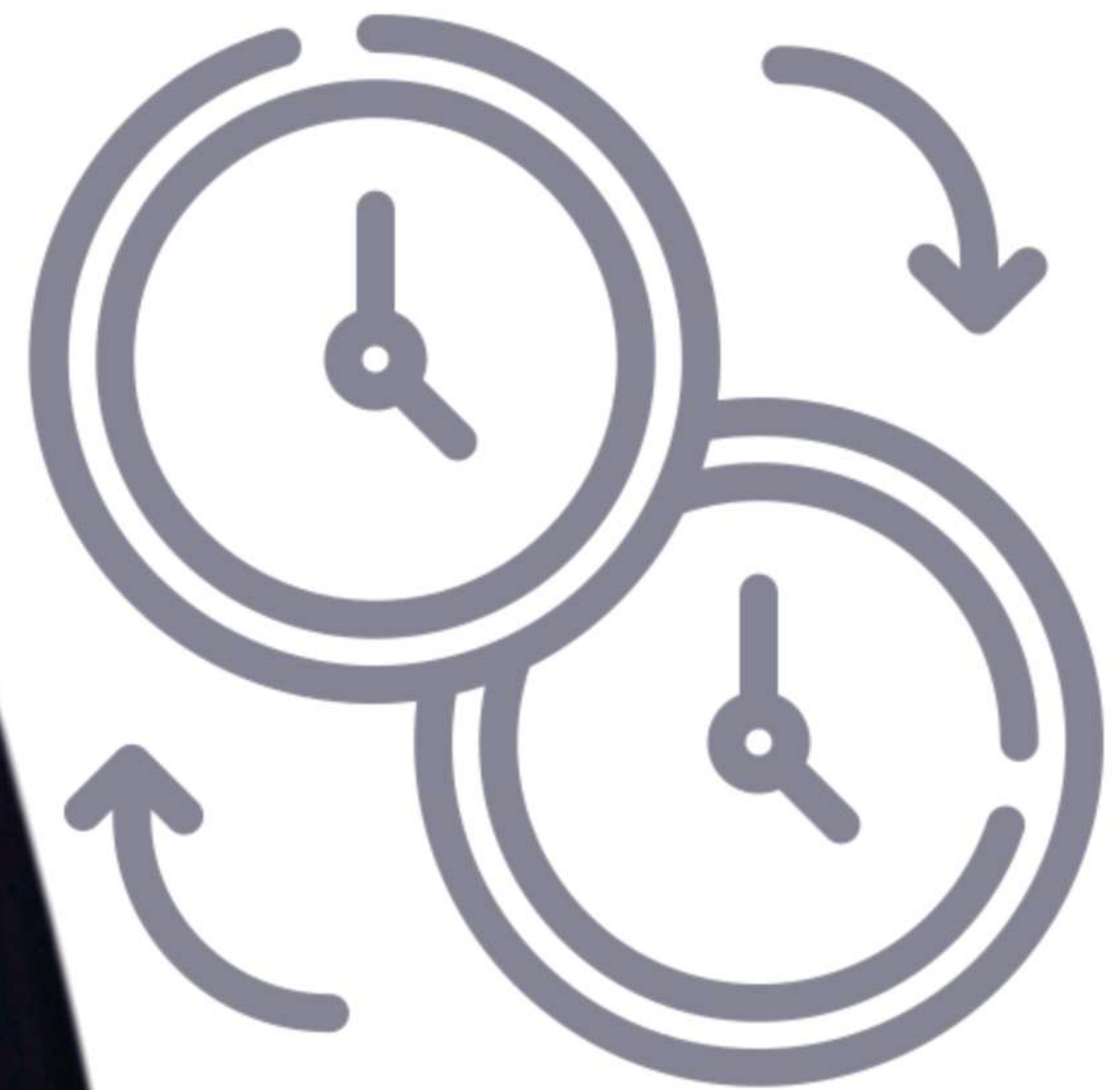


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THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS:

PROGRAMS & ACTIVITIES

JCIN UI OPERATION SAVE UP

Operation Save Up is a financial initiative designed to promote saving habits and financial discipline among members, preparing them for major commitments such as events, conferences, and other chapter programs. The initiative was first introduced in 2023 under the leadership of Bisola Kolawole, then Treasurer, and has remained a key tool for fostering financial responsibility.

The 2026 edition of Operation Save Up officially commenced on March 1. Members were encouraged to start by saving a minimum of 1,000 naira to build commitment and interest. This approach aims to help members plan effectively, save purposefully, and participate in events with confidence.

As of March, 6 members have started contributing, demonstrating early engagement and interest. Operation Save Up continues to strengthen financial discipline, accountability, and planning within the chapter. Sustained participation will support higher attendance at events, smoother funding for programs, and the development of financial intelligence across the Local Organization.

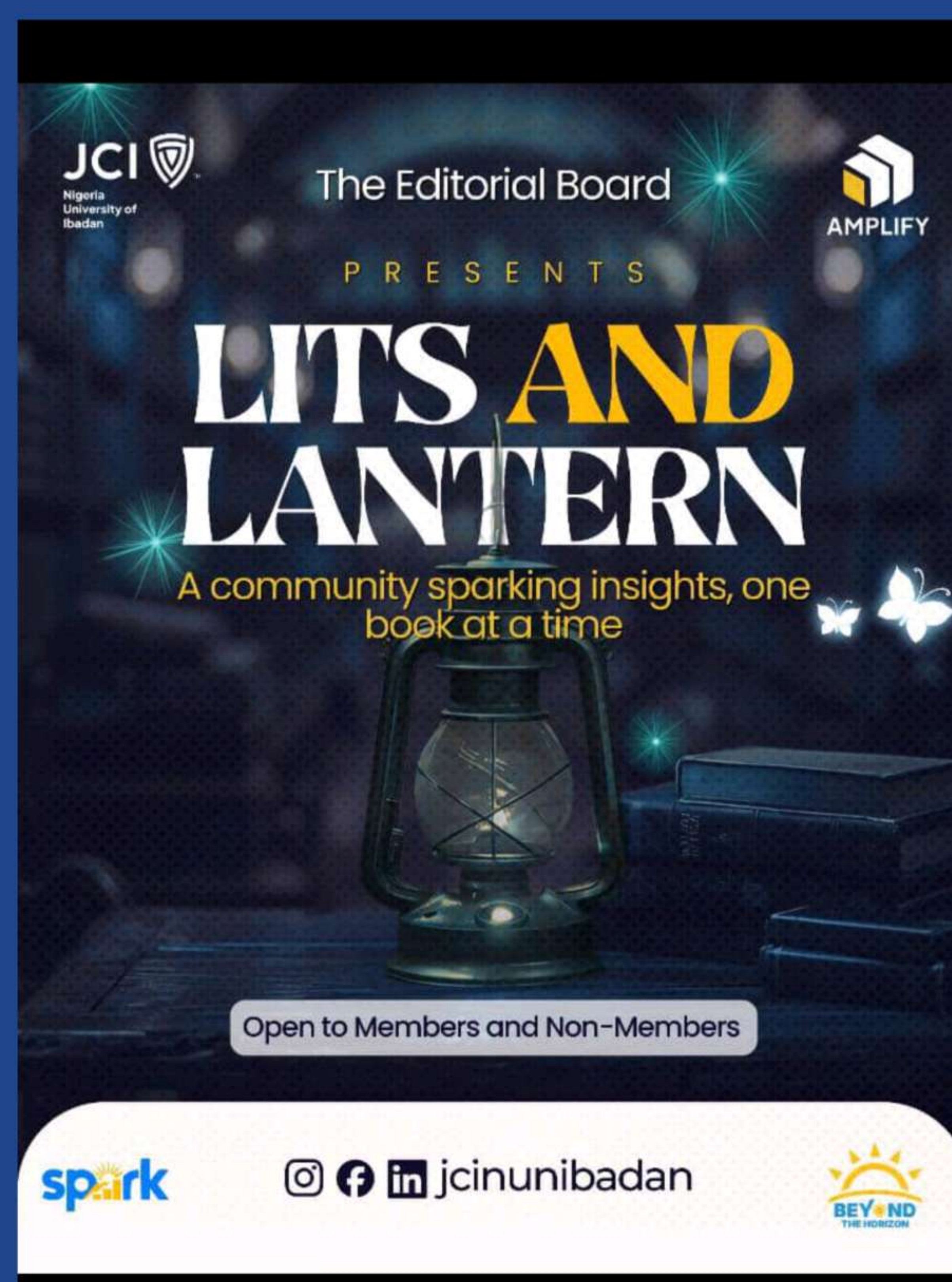


LITS AND LANTERNS

The Editorial Board of the Local Organization launched its first project, a book club called Lits and Lanterns, on March 5. The club is designed to foster meaningful conversations, spark insights, and connect members with diverse ideas and perspectives.

Lits and Lanterns is open to both JCI members and non-members, creating an inclusive space for learning and intellectual engagement. Currently, 38 people have expressed interest, reflecting strong enthusiasm and engagement from the chapter and the wider community.

The initiative encourages regular reading, critical thinking, and discussion, helping participants develop new ideas and share knowledge. Lits and Lanterns aims to become a platform for collaboration, mentorship, and personal growth, supporting the chapter's vision of inspiring continuous learning and active participation.



MATRICULATION AWARENESS

On March 11, the University of Ibadan held its Matriculation Ceremony for newly admitted students. The Directorate of Growth and Retention organized a Matriculation Awareness initiative to welcome freshers the JCI way.

The program highlighted the start of their journey toward impact, leadership, and personal growth. Eleven members, including the Local Organization President, engaged directly with new students using fliers and placards for photo opportunities. Social media graphics were also used to increase visibility before and during the event.

As a result, over 50 students were successfully added to the recruitment wait-list group. Feedback from students was positive, reflecting appreciation for the welcoming approach and ease of registration.

The initiative strengthened JCIN UI's visibility among new students and reinforced the chapter's recruitment efforts for 2026.

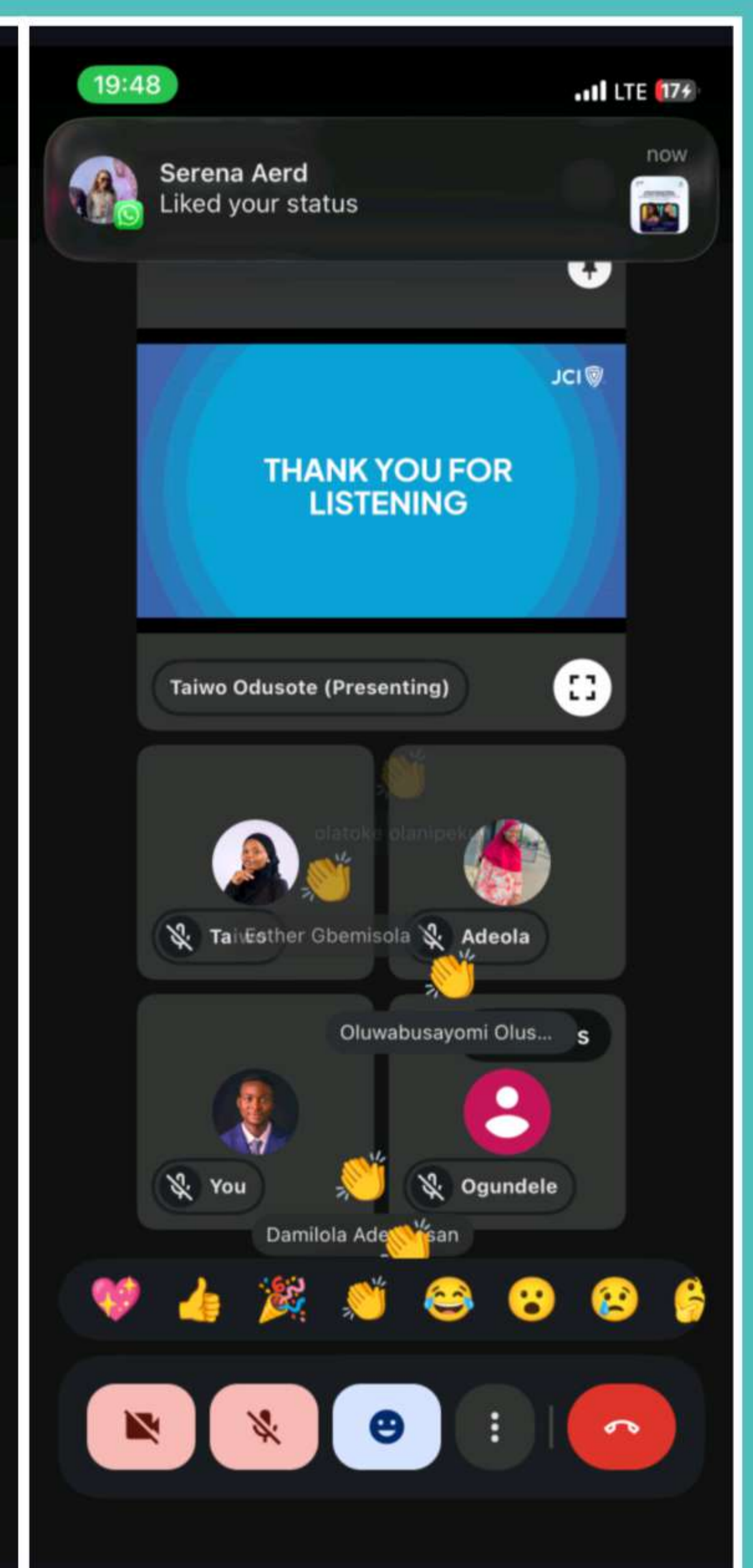
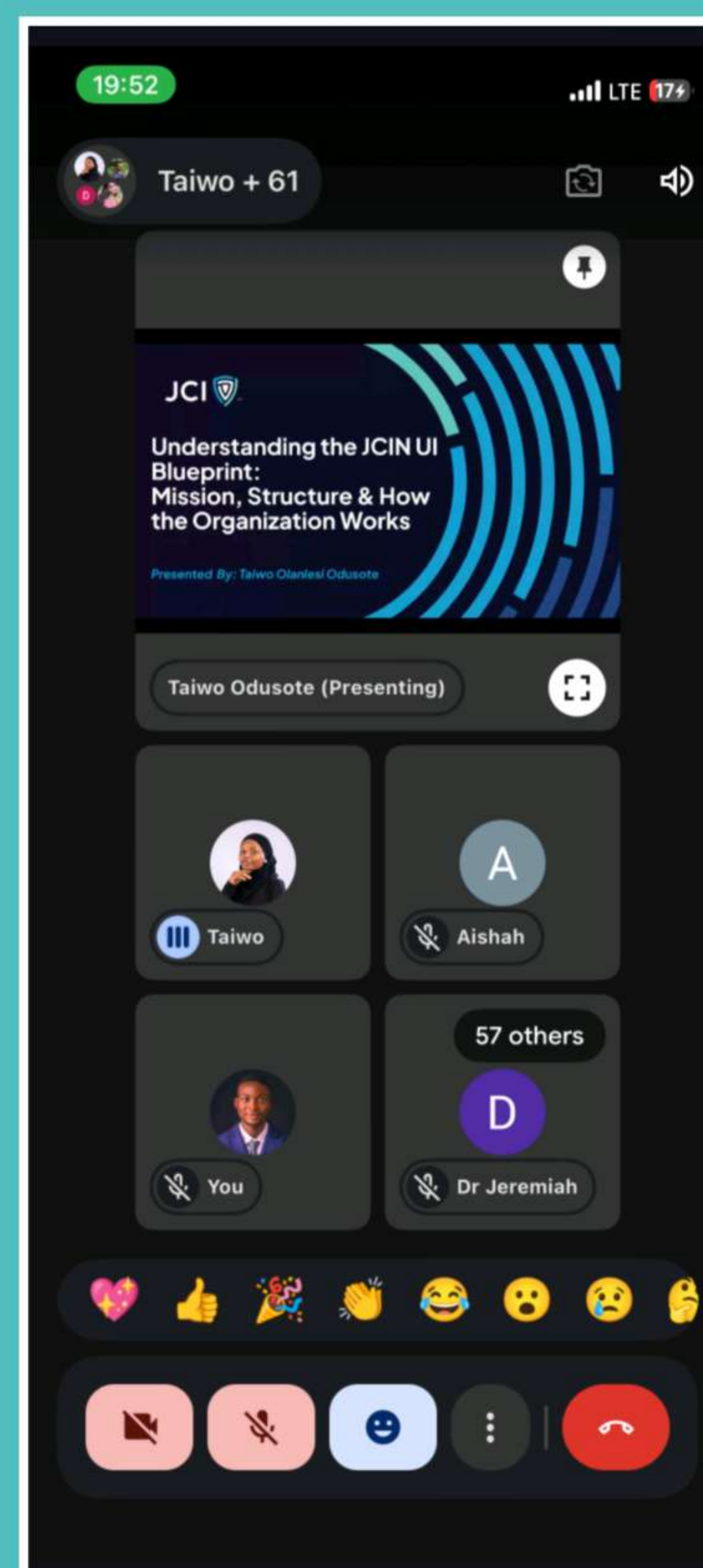


INFO SESSION (THE JCIN UI BLUEPRINT)

On March 17, a session themed “The JCIN UI Blueprint” was facilitated by JCIN Councillor Blessing Olayinka Ogundele and JCIN Councillor Taiwo Olanlesi Odunsote. The session aimed to help members and prospective members understand the mission, structure, and opportunities within JCIN UI, and to guide them in navigating their journey as members.

Speakers provided in-depth insights into the chapter’s mission, vision, and structure. Personal experiences were shared to inspire trust, interest, and engagement in the organization. An interactive segment allowed attendees to ask questions and receive clarifications.

The session attracted over 80 participants, reflecting strong interest and engagement from members and intending members. The initiative strengthened understanding of JCIN UI and encouraged active participation in the chapter’s programs.



RECRUITMENT PROCESS REVIEW

The recruitment process for JCIN UI in March was marked by deliberate engagement and strong participation. Activities were designed to introduce new students to the organization, highlight opportunities for growth, and encourage membership registration.

The Directorate of Growth and Retention organized a Matriculation Awareness initiative on March 11 during the University's Matriculation Ceremony. Eleven members, including the Local Organization President, engaged directly with over 50 new students, using fliers and placards to communicate information. The effort increased visibility and generated interest among prospective members. Following this, "The JCIN UI Blueprint" session on March 17 provided over 80 participants with detailed insights into the chapter's mission, vision, structure, and opportunities. Interactive segments allowed attendees to ask questions and gain clarity about membership and involvement in the organization.

Membership forms officially closed on March 21. Through the combined efforts of outreach, awareness initiatives, and engagement activities, 194 forms were sold by the initial deadline. A 24-hour extended sale on March 25 allowed additional prospective members to register, bringing the total forms sold to 216.

The recruitment process successfully generated interest, increased visibility, and strengthened the pipeline of new members for JCIN UI. Early engagement through awareness initiatives and information sessions laid a solid foundation for sustained growth and active participation within the chapter.



INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

The International Women's Day was celebrated on March 8 by the Local Organization through the Directorate of Community Development and SDGs. An insightful session was organized featuring Ms. Adesewa Oyinloye, providing an opportunity to explore the balance between personal strengths and weaknesses.

The session, themed "The Modern Day Woman: Her Strengths and Weaknesses," created a platform for women to reflect on their abilities, embrace vulnerability, and recognize the value of the communities they build. Over 30 members participated in the session, gaining practical insights on leadership, personal development, and the impact of women in both personal and professional spaces.

The initiative reinforced the chapter's commitment to empowering women and promoting growth, self-awareness, and meaningful engagement within the organization.

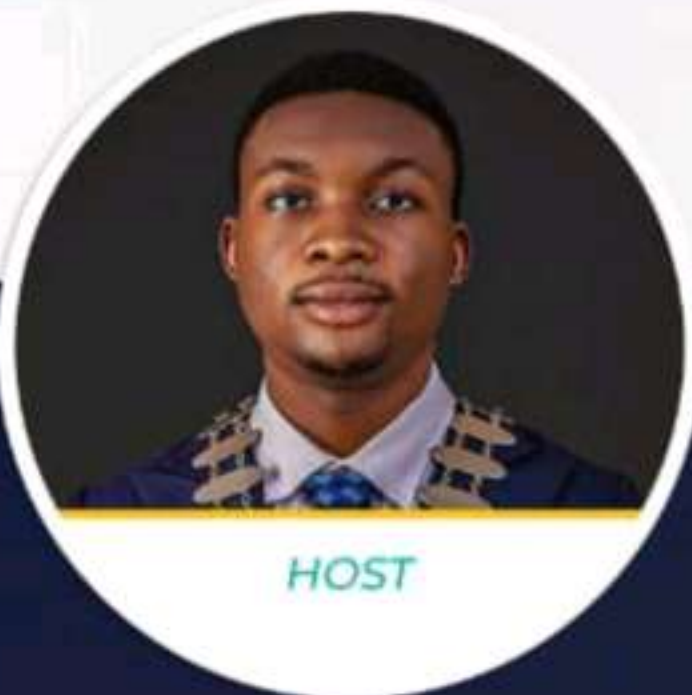

THRIVING YOUNG LEADERS TRAINING SESSIONS 3

On Tuesday, March 31, 2026, the Directorate of Training and Individual Opportunities successfully hosted the third edition of its monthly online training series, tagged “Thriving Young Leaders Training.” The session was themed “From Idea to Execution: The Student’s Guide to Successful Entrepreneurship” and was facilitated by JCIN Ambassador Owoyale Kikelomo, 2026 President, JCI Lagos Metropolitan. The session was moderated by Idowu Babosha and marked a key step in strengthening capacity within the Local Organization.

Held virtually at 7:00 PM, the training recorded over 35 active participants. The session focused on transforming ideas into actionable ventures, with emphasis on practical steps, discipline, and execution strategies required for successful entrepreneurship. Participants gained insights into planning, decision-making, and overcoming common challenges in moving from concept to implementation.

The session was interactive, with participants actively engaging and contributing throughout the discussion. It concluded with appreciation to the facilitator for delivering a practical and impactful session.

PARTNERSHIPS: WORLD DOWN SYNDROME DAY (COLLABORATION WITH JCI IBADAN ELITE)

World Down Syndrome Day is observed annually on March 21 to promote awareness, inclusion, and support for individuals with Down syndrome and those connected to them. In 2026, the Local Organization partnered with JCI Ibadan Elite, the host organization, alongside other local and international organizations to support the theme “Together Against Loneliness.”

To drive impact, a week-long awareness campaign was carried out from March 21 to March 28. The campaign focused on educating the public on Down syndrome, promoting inclusion, and encouraging the creation of safe and supportive spaces. Activities included daily content such as infographics, video campaigns, and educational materials highlighting facts, inclusion practices, and the importance of belonging.

A webinar session was held during the campaign on the theme “Different Abilities, Equal Belonging,” featuring national and international speakers. The session addressed the realities of individuals with Down syndrome and emphasized practical ways to promote inclusion and equal opportunities.

On March 28, a novelty match was organized as part of the closing activities, featuring JCI Ibadan Elite against Ibadan Soccer Ambassadors. The Local Organization was represented by five members, with two members actively participating in the match. The event served as a platform to promote unity, awareness, and shared responsibility in supporting individuals with Down syndrome.

The collaboration strengthened partnerships with other organizations and reinforced commitment to community development and inclusion. The initiative highlighted the role of collective action in creating awareness and building a society where every individual feels valued and included.

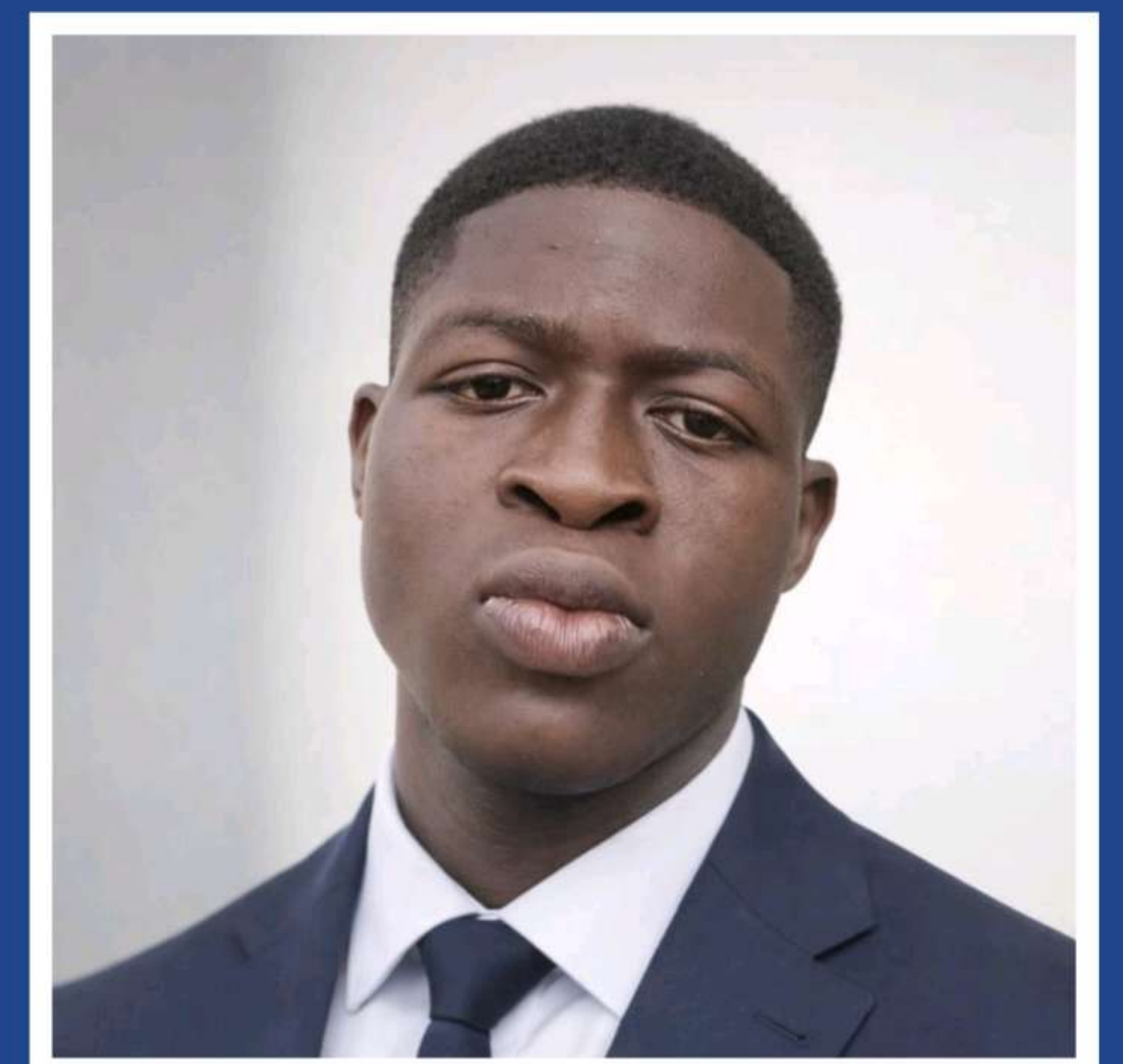
